Examples Word Origin

noun

1. irony that is inherent in speeches or a situation of a drama and is understood by the audience but not grasped by the characters in the play.

DISNEY EXAMPLES

- Snow White – Evil queen with the poisoned apple, the audience knows but Snow White doesn't
- Frozen – Audience knows Elsa has powers but Anna doesn't
- Etc etc.

SITUATIONAL IRONY

situational irony

noun


1. irony involving a situation in which actions have an effect that is opposite from what was intended, so that the outcome is contrary to what was expected.

SITUATIONAL IRONY

- This is the most common understanding of irony when people say “that’s ironic”
- Example
 - A fire station burns down
 - A marriage counselor files for divorce
 - Police station gets robbed

ALLUSION

al·lu·sion

/əˈlʊʒən/ 

noun

an expression designed to call something to mind without mentioning it explicitly; an indirect or passing reference.

"an allusion to Shakespeare"

synonyms: reference to, mention of, suggestion of, hint to, intimation of, comment on, remark on
"the town's name is an **allusion to** its founding family"

- the practice of making allusions, especially as an artistic device.

ALLUSION

TONE

- The attitude you feel in a poem because of details converging

 - Do they accurately represent the plot of a movie?
 - Accurate representations of the characters?
 - They in fact show us the feeling or genre of a movie (tone)

- “Details converging” – what details converged to create the tone of the previews we just saw?
- Things that contribute to poem's tone are
 - Dialogue
 - Word Choice
 - Figurative Language
 - Line length
 - Punctuation
 - Rhythm
