The Role Of The Senate

- Senators must be 30 years of age, own property worth at least \$ 4,000 in the province where they reside.
- When Senators die or retire (at 75), the Prime Minister, with the formal approval at the Governor General, decides who will be appointed.
- Primary purpose (at the time of confederation 1867) was to act as a second legislative house providing regional <u>not popular</u> representation.
- 24 Ont, 24 Que, 6 BC, 6 Alta, 6 Man, 6 Sask, 1 NU, 10 NB, 4 PEI, 6 NFLD, 1 NWT, 1 Yukon.
- Second major purpose to give "sober second thought" to legislation coming from the house of commons.
 - *has the power to VETO (forbid) legislation, rarely happens.
- Third purpose to 'polish' legislation, from the commons committee work.
- These committees don't make significant changes to the content, they deal with the precise wording and technical details.
- A senator can also be a Cabinet Member / Minister if the Prime Minister needs representation from part of the country that s/he doesn't have any MP's in.
